

System Introduction

Thank you for choosing the Rose Electronics CrystalLink USB3.1 fiber optic extender. This product enables users to extend beyond the standard 10ft (3meter) cable distance limit for USB 3.1 peripheral devices. With the CrystalLink USB3.1, certain USB3.1 devices can be located up to 100 meters from the computer. The CrystalLink USB3.1 supports only USB3.1 devices. USB2.0 and USB1.1 devices will not function through this extender.

The instructions in this manual assume a general knowledge of computer installation procedures, familiarity with cabling requirements, and some familiarity with USB device operation.

Please note that previous documentation may have referred to this product as being USB 3.0 compliant. The USB standards committee has renamed USB 3.0 to USB 3.1 gen 1. The names USB 3.0 and USB 3.1 gen 1 are synonymous. In keeping with the progression of the standards, we are following this convention.

Features

- Extends USB3.1 devices beyond the standard 10ft (3 meter) cable limit for USB3.1 peripherals, up to 330ft (100m) over fiber optic cable
- Integrated 2-port hub provides support for 2 different USB3.1 peripherals in industrial environments
- Uses standard 50/125µm multimode fiber cable terminated with one duplex LC type connector
- Fiber cable ensures high-speed (up to 5Gbps) transmission, electrical isolation, high reliability, and transmission security
- Secure USB device connection using USB and power locking connectors
- Works with AIA USB3 Vision™ compliant devices
- Plug-and-Play installation, no configuration, driver installation or set-up required
- Supports all major operating systems: Windows®, Mac OS X®, and Linux®
- The receiver unit requires a 24VDC power adapter (included). The transmitter unit is USB interface powered

Package Contents

Unpacking.

The equipment comes with the standard parts shown in package content. Check and make sure they are included and in good condition. If anything is missing, or damaged, contact your supplier immediately.

Additional Items that may be required

- USB3.1 compatible computer (host computer) with a USB3.1 compliant operating system
- USB3.1 compatible device
- 2-strand 50/125µm multimode (MMF) fiber optic cable with Duplex LC connectors
- Mounting bracket for control desk, table-top or wall mount.

The mounting bracket may be ordered separately from Rose Electronics

All references to USB3.1 cables in this document refer to the maximum recommended distances for the cable type. Maximum recommended cable distances should not be exceeded.

CrystalLink USB3.1 Fiber Extender Models

The CrystalLink USB3.1 fiber extender enables users to locate high-speed USB device(s) up to 330 feet (100 meters) from the computer.

Transmitter Unit

The transmitter connects to the host device using the supplied USB3.1 cable. Power for the transmitter unit is provided by the host computer. Power and status LED's are conveniently located on the front panel for user reference.




Figure 1. transmitter unit - LED's and connectors

Receiver Unit

The receiver unit has two USB3.1 Type-A ports for connecting up to two USB3.1 devices. The receiver is powered directly by the included 24VDC power supply, delivering 900mA of current per USB port.




Figure 2. receiver unit - LED's and connectors

Installation

Unpack the CrystalLink USB3.1 extender and check the contents of the package.

If the product is to be permanently mounted, first test the extension to confirm the system is working correctly by using a short fiber optic link cable. Power on the USB3.1 device, then the receiver, followed by the PC. Check to confirm the full operation of the USB3.1 device.

Once the extension has been verified, then attach the mounting brackets as required and proceed with the full system installation.




Figure 3. CrystalLink USB3.1 cabling layout diagram

Preparing Your Site

Before you can install the CrystalLink USB3.1 extender, you need to prepare your site:

- Determine where the computer is to be located and set up the computer.
- Determine where you want to locate the USB3.1 device(s).
- Ensure fiber optic cabling is in place, prepared, properly terminated, and within the maximum distances as defined for the cabling standard used.

Fiber Optic Link Cabling

The transmitter and receiver units are interconnected by multimode fiber optic cabling. This cabling must be:

- 50/125µm multimode fiber (MMF)
- Terminated with Duplex LC connectors

The following maximum distances are achievable depending on the application and cabling standard:

- Using OM3 fiber optic cable, up to 330ft (100 meters) is achievable with USB 3.1 cameras, and up to 165ft (50 meters) for all other applications.
- Using OM2 fiber optic cable, up to 50m is achievable for all applications.

These maximum distances include any fiber patch cords or patch panel interface.

Up to 165ft (50 meters) with USB3.1 storage type devices and up to 330ft (100 meters) is achievable when using USB3.1 bulk traffic cameras. For Microsoft Kinect applications, please use the Rose USB3.1 active extension cable.

If premise cabling will be used for the installation, then the distances provided above must be met when measuring from Transmitter to Receiver, inclusive of the premise cabling and the patch cables. All cables must meet the ratings specified. Patch cables must be terminated with Duplex LC connectors

Setting Up Your Computer

The CrystalLink USB3.1 does not support suspend modes of operation. As such, your computer should be configured to not go into "suspend mode" or to "suspend" the USB ports.

To check the suspend mode settings on your computer:

Windows (7/8/8.1/10)

To disable "suspend" settings on your computer, please follow these steps:





Figure 4. Changing Suspend Mode settings on a Windows PC




Figure 5. Changing Suspend Mode settings on a MAC computer

Connecting a USB3.1 Device

- 1. Install any software required to operate the USB device(s). Refer to the documentation for the USB device(s), as required.
- 2. Connect the USB device to the device port on the receiver unit. If you are using a USB3.1 Vision compliant locking USB cable, then you can use the locking knobs to lock the cable to the port on the receiver unit.
- 3. Check that the device is detected and installed properly in the operating system.




Figure 7. USB3.1 connector interface

Installing the Receiver Unit

- 1. Place the receiver unit near the USB device(s).
- 2. Plug the power adapter into a suitable AC outlet.
- 3. Connect the power adapter to the receiver unit and twist the connector to lock the power connector into the receiver unit.

Installing the Transmitter Unit

- 1. Place the transmitter unit near the computer.
- 2. Connect the fiber optic link cable to the transmitter and the receiver.
- 3. Install the supplied USB3.1 cable between the transmitter and a USB3.1 port on the host computer.

Installing with Surface Cabling

- 1. Plug one end of the fiber optic cabling (not included) into the link port on the transmitter unit.
- 2. Plug the other end of the fiber optic cabling into the link port on the receiver unit.

Installing with Premise Cabling

- 1. Plug one end of a fiber optic patch cord (not included) into the link port on the transmitter unit.
- 2. Plug the other end of the patch cord into the fiber optic information outlet near the host computer.
- 3. Plug one end of the 2nd fiber optic patch cord (not included) into the link port on the receiver unit.
- 4. Plug the other end of the 2nd patch cord into the fiber optic information outlet near the USB device.

The CrystalLink USB3.1 will not operate on a USB2.0 port or with a USB2.0 device; please ensure you connect to a USB3.1 port. USB3.1 ports are blue and USB 2.0 ports are typically white or black.

Checking the Installation (for PC users)

- 1. On the local and remote extender units, check that the Power, Status, and Host LEDs are on and solid.
- 2. If the Host or Status LEDs are permanently off, then the cabling between the local and remote extender units may not be installed properly or is defective.
- 3. For Windows users, open Device Manager to confirm that the CrystalLink USB3.1 has installed correctly.
- 4. Expand the entry for Universal Serial Bus controllers by clicking the [+] sign. If the CrystalLink USB3.1 has been installed correctly, you should find it listed as two [SuperSpeed Hubs], or [3.1 Hubs].




Figure 8. Installation check for PC users

Checking the Installation (for MAC users)

- 1. For Mac OS X users, open the System Profiler to confirm that the CrystalLink USB3.1 has installed correctly.
- 2. In the left-hand column under Hardware, select "USB" and inspect the right-hand panel.
- 3. If the CrystalLink USB3.1 has been installed correctly, you should find it listed as a [Hub] under the USB SuperSpeed Bus.




Figure 9. Installation check for MAC users

Checking the Installation (for Linux users)

- 1. For Linux users, plug in a USB 3.1 device into the Remote Extender.
- 2. Open a terminal and run the [lsusb] command.
- 3. The extender should show up as a USB3.1 hub device with a Vendor ID of 0000h and Product ID of 0000h.
- 4. If the CrystalLink USB3.1 is not detected correctly or fails to detect, please consult the Troubleshooting section in this guide.

Compatibility

The CrystalLink USB3.1 complies with USB3.1 specifications governing the design of USB devices. However, Rose Electronics does not guarantee that all USB3.1 devices are compatible with the CrystalLink USB3.1, as there are a number of different configurations that may impact the operation of USB3.1 devices over extended distances.

Transmitter and Receiver Mounting Options

The bottom of the chassis includes four convenient pre-drilled holes for optional mounting. Based on your requirements, choose from two available mounting options:

- USB Extender Mounting Kit (Purchased separately USB Mounting Kit Black)
- USB Extender Direct Surface Mounting (Using your own M3 screws to your pre-drilled surface)

Option 1: CrystalLink USB3.1 Extender Mounting Bracket Kit

Contents:

- 2 mounting brackets
- 4 (M3) locking washers
- 4 (M3 x 5mm) Phillips screws

Mounting bracket installation guide (see diagram below)

1 kit is required to mount each transmitter chassis or receiver chassis Using a Phillips screwdriver, fasten and secure the provided screws, locking washers and brackets into place.

Option 2: CrystalLink USB3.1 Extender Mounting Plate

The bottom of the enclosure features four pre-drilled holes for optional surface mounting with a spacing of 42.0mm x 77.0mm. Drill four holes into your surface and mount it using proper length M3 screws. Note: Do not exceed a screw depth of 3/16" (4.7625mm) into the chassis or damage may occur




Figure 10. Chassis mounting options

TROUBLESHOOTING

Troubleshooting

The following table provides troubleshooting tips. The topics are arranged in the order in which they should be executed in most situations. If you are unable to resolve the problem after following these instructions, please contact Technical Support for further assistance.

PROBLEM	CAUSE	SOLUTION
All LEDs on local extender are off.	The local extender is not receiving power from the USB port.	 Ensure that the USB connection between the local extender and host computer is properly installed. Move the USB connector to another USB port on the host computer.
All LEDs on local extender are off.	 The remote extender is not receiving power from the AC adapter. 	 Ensure that the AC power adapter is properly connected to the remote extender. Check that the AC adapter is connected to a live source of electrical power.
Status LEDs on both the local and remote extender units are blinking.	 There is no connection between the local and remote extender units. The local extender is not connected to a USB3.1 port. The host computer does not support USB3.1. 	 Ensure that the host computer supports USB3.1, refer to your computer's manual for confirmation. Ensure the remote extender is connected to a USB3.1 port. The centre of the port connector should be blue. Another color, such as black usually indicates a USB2.0 port. Ensure that a LC multimode fiber optic cable is connected between the local and remote extender units. Connect a fiber optic patch cord between the local and remote extender units. Recheck operation of the system.
Host LED is blinking on one or both units.	 The computer went into suspend, hibernate or sleep mode. The computer tried to suspend the USB3.1 port that is connected to the local extender. 	 Follow the steps in "Setting up your computer" on to disable suspend modes on your computer. Refer to your operating system's manual for additional instructions if necessary.
